


BOARD MEMBER PROFILE

The Association is responsible for establishing a Board of Directors which consists of seven elected members from the parent association and two appointed members, one appointed by the Board of Directors and one appointed by the United States Ambassador of Uganda.



The Board has collective responsibility to the students, staff, faculty and the Association of the school. Board members work together to carry out core functions such as:

Fiduciary oversight, overseeing the financial affairs of ISU.

Strategic foresight, contributing to the policies and plans of ISU.

Generative insight, ensuring there is clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.

Risk management, ensuring regular risk analysis and risk mitigation.

Two-way communications, ensuring the voices of stakeholders are heard and that decisions and rationale of the Board are shared transparently with the stakeholders.

The Board members also have individual responsibilities being committed to the ISU vision, mission and values and to act with reasonable care and skill. Board members need to participate fully and frankly in deliberations and discussions of the Board in a respectful manner that encourages free and open discussion in Board meetings and attend Board and committee meetings well prepared. Board members recognise that decisions can best be made by being well-informed and knowledgeable about the school governance and international education, including emerging trends and significant developments. Board members should apply personal ability, experience, and understanding to matters brought to the Board.
